- Art in Tanzania is an NGO established in 2001, first as a sole proprietorship and then
 registered as a Tanzanian NGO in 2007 with the registration number OONGO 1013 and
 operating in Dar es Salaam.
- We have around 20 staff members, including five graduate professionals guiding the student programs. In addition, we have 15-50 international volunteers and interns in Tanzania all year round and numerous Tanzanian participants. Participants live in our compound while focusing on supporting the surrounding schools and communities.
 We also provide remote internship options when needed.
- Our focus points include education, medical health and raising awareness about HIV/AIDS. We also organize sports events, training, and support art and movie production, media, and tourism. In addition, we focus on different social and environmental issues through our Children's Agenda program, Climate Change program and Corporate Social Responsibility program, among others.

Our community-based programs empower local communities and individuals. While interns experience daily life in Tanzania, you also have the opportunity to witness one of the fastest-growing economies in Africa.

Accommodation

In Dar es Salaam you stay at our Student Hostel in Madale village, some 30 km from the city centre. Madale is a peaceful rural village area with fast access to town. It is an eco-compound: we use dry toilets, collect urine and shower water for the irrigation of our large garden, organic compost waste and install eco-friendly solar innovations, among others.

Costs and benefits

Paid interns get 2x the local minimum wage compensation, which means USD 100 per month. Start and end dates are flexible and can accommodate other travel arrangements in Tanzania. International flights, work permits, accommodation and meals are personal costs. We also

offer participants with disabilities personal assistants and drivers at additional expenses; USD 30 per week. 24-hour general assistance is available free of charge. Student volunteers need to apply for a Participation VISA. The VISA allows working for a charity organization: we will send you the documents required for the VISA once you have booked your stay with us. The cost of the VISA is USD50, and it allows for a stay of three months.


The start and end dates of the projects are flexible, and we can also accommodate other travel arrangements in Tanzania. International flights, work permits, accommodation, and meals are personal costs. In addition, we offer participants with disabilities personal assistants and drivers at additional expenses; USD 30 per week. 24- hour general assistance is free. Art in Tanzania offers internship options for physically challenged students looking to work with community development projects in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania, East Africa.



Summary

Art in Tanzania is a self-sustainable non-profit charity NGO in Tanzania. We have performed community-based development work and run self-sustainable operations since 1996.



Details

Our community-based programs are focused on empowering the local communities and individual people.

You experience the daily life and culture in Tanzania while also having the opportunity to witness the growth of one of the fastest-growing African economies.

Students will participate in and develop the daily operations of the NGO. We commonly have 15-40 students from different parts of the world, from over 400 universities we co-operate with and represent a variety of professions.

All this must be managed, including each student's weekly plans and reports, making budgets and accounts, developing ongoing community programs, and planning new approaches.

The internship outcome is to learn to use and get experience to implement your education in developing country conditions with limited capacitation and, most importantly, to learn work skills to run an NGO in Africa.

You can also conduct thesis and related tasks along with your internship placement.

The typical daily morning tasks include practical fieldwork in the schools and communities and planning, reporting, and social media visibility functions.

Summary

Art in Tanzania is partnering with a consortium of NGOs and private sector actors to evaluate and produce solutions to the combination of climate change effects on the socio-economy in rural Africa.

Details


Some 75% of Tanzanian people live in rural areas, and climate change will seriously affect their livelihood based on agricultural income.

The most vulnerable groups such as women, youth, and people living with disabilities are most affected.

This program is a multi-professional student approach to evaluating the present situation, considering future scenarios, and developing solution models.

ENVIRONMENTAL ADVOCACY

Summary

Art in Tanzania is introducing and implementing environmentally-friendly solutions for Tanzanian



communities. These solutions include dry toilets, composting and household water reuse, and solar water purification systems. We also emphasize sustainable tourism operations.

Details

Tanzanian communities lack the economic strength needed to implement environmentally friendly solutions in their households.

Presently less than 50% of households have a toilet. Interns are developing sustainable and affordable

solutions, including dry toilets for homes and schools.

This program includes an introduction to solar-based water purification as well. Other green work includes developing compost, finding sustainable sources for providing heat for cooking, developing tree and bamboo nurseries, educating the neighbourhood, and doing advocacy work.

Sustainable Wildlife Safaris and other tourism operations are essential local sources of funding. The

DISASTER MANAGEMENT

Summary

Art in Tanzania works with corporates and governmental institutions to tackle natural and artificial environmental disasters.



Details

Disaster management is poorly known. The public in common is not receiving education about sister management issues. People and their properties are affected by floods, earthquakes, landslides, diseases like malaria, cholera, hunger, poverty, desert, global warming due to climate change, and industrial incidents from poor health and safety in the workplace.

This program aims to educate and build Tanzanian people about resilience from the early stage to the last set of disaster management, such as mitigation, preparedness, response, and prevention at schools and public shares, with the help of the various governmental and non-governmental institutions.

Presently we work with entities such as Twiga Cement industries, Coca-cola, the Tanzania government, NBC Bank, PVC, and AG-Energies Company Ltd. We are extending our program to work United Nations Organization.

WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

Summary

Art in Tanzania supports and develops village women's initiatives. The main activities are vocational training in English, IT, entrepreneurship, women's rights, and related subjects. We are also

developing medical services and health information sessions.

Details

Tanzania has many young mothers in the villages with little or no education and financial support. In addition, areas that are often heavily populated complicate the strive for livelihood and provision for these Mother's children.

Most women lack the opportunity to reach education to fund and develop small businesses. Additionally, many



of these women are under-empowered or unaware of their fundamental human rights, thus making young mothers vulnerable to abuse.

Art in Tanzania focuses on delivering skills for women to start their small businesses and create markets for their products. At the same time, we educate women's rights and related subjects to learn their rights in problem situations. We focus on being both innovative and effective.

We are looking to hire multi-professional students and interns to support our work. We tailor the posts according to the participant's focus, interests, and skills.

We look to be innovative. Interns bring their ideas that we look for to strengthen the fieldwork. We encourage innovation and self-led creativity in the professional program approach.

Work with women is underfunded, but Art in Tanzania has multi-professional interns and volunteers. We use teamwork to create opportunities. For example, one can teach how to start horticulture and look for the markets. The base effort is to increase the small business skills through the educational approach and increase awareness.

We also focus on giving Visibility to women's issues through social media for the general Tanzanian population.

AFRICAN FOOTBALL YOUTH ACADEMY DEVELOPMENT



Summary

Art in Tanzania is developing youth football, assisting talent development of a Football Academy jointly with its partners.

Details

Football is the national sport in Tanzania. There is an enormous potential for young talented girls and boys. However, it is hard to produce professional football players due to their low capacities.

This program is a joint effort with our

partners as Briessfull Stars Organization of retired top Tanzanian football professionals and 7Elity Academy from Utah USA, having branches in the UK and South Africa and connected to top world football clubs.

We look for interns and volunteers to join and assist in coaching, ball, and physical training activities. Also, advocate for young players about good nutrition, hygiene, and other public health issues.

Participants can also assist in the village and school sports activities.

CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

Summary

Art in Tanzania and its partners work with the Tanzanian corporate and government institutions to tackle Corporate Social Responsibility issues. These topics also include actions against climate change.

Details



Private citizens' social responsibility is commonly well recognized and introduced in school curriculums and public advocacy programs in the Western world.

Tanzanian public does not know corporate social responsibility. Issues. As a result, corporate policies commonly don't consider social responsibility issues seriously.

At the same time, Tanzania is one country where climate change strongly affects the agriculture-based economy. But, in fairness, many people do not understand the climate change issues either.

This program aims to educate the schools and the public about social responsibility and deliver the message in the schools with the help of the Tanzanian business community.

We currently work with entities such as Dar es Salaam University, TWIGA Cement, Airtel, PVC, NBC Bank, and Coca-Cola, extending the program further. The field operations include working in a tree nursery and partaking in planting operations.

This program has a cross-cutting focus where students of different professions can attend and work together.

Our media tools include arts, music, and film. In addition, we offer an immersive experience for students who desire to use innovative and creative African media tools.


Our media is advocacy, Visibility, and marketing-focused. In addition, we provide in-country orientation, training, and academic tutoring for the program.

The Human Rights program includes working with Tanzanian human rights professionals focusing on



children's, women's, and disabled people's rights and limited sexual rights. In addition, students can include research and thesis focus for the program.

Details

Art in Tanzania Children's Agenda program focuses on Children's and Women's Rights. We also have a Rights team consisting of our team members, private Tanzanian people such as lawyers, other rights-oriented citizens and participating interns and volunteers.

Practical work includes advocacy, partaking in seminars, teaching, and gaining more Visibility. Rights issues are always sensitive matters, and teamwork and networking are essential.

A consortium of Tanzanian NGOs, including UNICEF, Save the Children, and others, developed and ran the Children's

Agenda program chaired by the Ministry of Community Work Gender and Children.

Summary

Art in Tanzania focuses on helping with educational tasks in the nursery, primary and secondary


schools in Tanzania, and adult vocational training. The schools we help are mostly poor village schools. Interns focus on developing primary education and also conduct advocacy work.

Details

Art in Tanzania's Educational program is part of our Children's Agenda approach implemented by a coalition including UNICEF and Save the Children. We work in a village nursery and primary and secondary schools, but we also run adult vocational training where the focal point is the women.

The program also includes classes for children living with disabilities. Participants are specifically needed to cover subjects where the schools are weak.

Areas of development include English, arts and music, mathematics, and sports teaching.



Interns also advocate raising awareness about HIV/AIDS, health, and hygiene. Debate-based English training is a trendy subject. We use our social media pages for advocacy work, and our Facebook pages have more than 50K followers. We also highlight teacher-training activities.

Classroom tools are scarce, and the number of pupils in a school can be more than 40.

Details

Tanzanian pharmacies are far from western standards. Specifically, small village pharmacies need training and advocacy to develop their quality.

Intern pharmacists work under the direct supervision and control of a pharmacist.

Removing the drug or drugs from stock;
Counting, pouring, or mixing pharmaceuticals;
Placing the product into containers;
Affixing the label or labels to the container; and
Packaging and repackaging
Bringing your education knowledge to the African pharmacy operations

The community psychology program covers education programs, women's programs, human rights issues, corporate social responsibility approach, and other development tasks on the grassroots level in Africa.

Details

The placement focuses on children in poverty, children youth with disabilities, orphaned children, unemployed youth, women in poverty, people with HIV, people recovering from trauma, addiction recovery, the elderly, art sector, education, etc. Clinical placements are also available.

Tanzanian pharmacies are far from western standards.

Specifically, small village pharmacies need training and advocacy to develop their prototypes.

The medical program also includes HIV/AIDS counselling advocacy, testing, and events for raising awareness.

Art in Tanzania looks to set itself apart from the crowd regarding safari and tour business by offering sustainable travel options. Commonly safaris are sold by tour agents located in the western world. They sell the safaris, but only part of the money comes to Tanzania to support the economy.

Typically, villages around famous national parks are the poorest of the poor. The profit we get from our tours comes to Tanzania and is used to support the Tanzanian economy and community development activities.

CHILDREN UNDER SCHOOL AGE DEVELOPMENT

Summary

Art in Tanzania has partnered with UNICEF, Save the Children, and other NGOs as a part of The Children's Agenda Initiative in Tanzania. This program focuses on Tanzania's Early Childhood and Children's Rights issues.



Details

40 Tanzanian NGOs, including UNICEF and Save the Children, created The Children's Agenda program. The primary focus is on children's rights to education, medication, sanitation, and other necessities.

We also work closely with children's families to meet their needs. Art in Tanzania tailors its efforts as the media team leader to give Visibility to the program and its results.

The program has ten key investment points: Invest to Save the Lives of Children and Women, Invest in Good Nutrition, Invest in Better Hygiene and Sanitation in Schools and Health Facilities, Invest in Early Childhood Development, Invest in Quality Education for all Children, Invest to Make Schools Safe, Invest to Protect Infants and Adolescent Girls from HIV, Invest to Reduce Teenage Pregnancy,

Invest to Protect Children from Violence, Abuse, and Exploitation and Invest in Children with Disabilities.







SUSTAINABLE CONSTRUCTION

Summary

Art in Tanzania (NGO) is looking for students to help us develop our Eco-campus in Madale village. We focus on growing as an eco-building role model in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania. We are testing

traditional African construction materials and methods.



Details

We use locally sourced bamboo to build basic dry toilets and simple greywater collection systems for irrigation. In addition, we look to learn from traditional African construction, using locally sourced materials such as mud, trees, hey, stones, and other resources and techniques commonly used in the villages and tribes.

Modern techniques include solar and led lights, but we also use innovation and creativity to develop interior design combining modern technology, traditional style, and ecomaterials.

In addition, we encourage local builders, youth, and international volunteers and interns to learn different techniques oriented towards a more ecological style of living.

We wish to implement tree houses and similar new designs

and creative construction solutions.

Eco-products used in interior design, such as led lampshades made of natural materials, can also help to provide women with more employment opportunities.
